Helping You Feel Safer The Horowhenua Community Camera Trust

In 2001 safety of the Horowhenua community was threatened following a spate of criminal activity. A need for community cameras to help people feel safer was recognised. Two years later the Levin Crime Prevention Camera Trust was established.

Since 2020 the Trust has promoted itself under the brand SEEN – Horowhenua Community Camera Trust, more representative of the area it covers. Initially the Trust sourced funding to purchase and install six cameras and monitoring equipment. Now they operate 30 cameras in Horowhenua including 13 installed at Foxton Beach last October. All are connected to the Levin monitoring system which operates from the Levin Police Station.

The Trust would like to cover all of the Horowhenua and has set its sights on raising funds for more cameras. Donations are gratefully received and could enable another part of the community to have 24/7 monitoring, ensuring everyone feels safer. Police have acknowledged how valuable the service is to them in our region.

More volunteers to monitor the cameras from the Levin Police Station are being recruited. If you have a spare few hours any day or time, are a little bit techno savvy, are comfortable with a Police check



and want a safer community, you could be considered for training to become an operator.
