Coastguard Kapiti Coast began in February 2006, from separate Coastguard units at Waikanae and Paraparaumu Beaches. The primary area covered by Coastguard Kapiti Coast's two diesel powered jet boats runs from Pukerua Bay to Otaki which

can extend from Foxton to south of Makara in a major search, or if a neighbouring unit is out of service.

Boats cost around \$40,000 a year to operate and fund raising is ongoing, especially as a new boat is under construction. Supporters and sponsors are always welcome.

The Kapiti Unit responds to around 30 calls for assistance annually. Many could have resulted in loss of life, if not for the timely assistance of the fully trained Coastguard team. There are approximately four hours of training for every operational hour undertaken by the team.

Monday is training night, from 7pm, held at sheds adjoining both the Kapiti Boating Club, Kapiti Road, Paraparaumu, and Waikanae Boating Club, Tutere Street, Waikanae Beach.

If you've got no electric hot water or it doesn't feel as hot as it should be, call us first.



It might not be a problem with your appliance or wiring, it could be that we've temporarily turned off the electricity supply to your hot water cylinder. We call this 'load control'.

Check with us for FREE

Before you call the plumber or electrician and get charged a call-out fee, check your electric hot water load control status FIRST.

You can do this either by:

- visiting our website to check the current load status (in real time)
- calling us on 0800 567 876

If your hot water problem isn't due to load control, we'll send a Faultsperson to your home to check your electricity supply. Only once they've confirmed the problem isn't related to our network should you call a plumber or electrician.
