## Electra celebrates 100 years of service to Kapiti and Horowhenua

The Horowhenua Electric Power Board was established in February 1922 with the first electricity generated from the newly opened Mangaore Stream Steam







Plant on 3 November 1923 and from the Mangahao Power Station on 13 May 1924. Electric power generated from the Mangahao hydro works was fed into the reticulation sevicing the Horowhenua District. "It immediately began transmitting electricity to dairy farmers, factories and flax mills in Horowhenua (678 Customers). Over 300 miles of 110kV transmission lines had been built by the Public Works Department and the power would be supplied from eight substations."

In 1994 the company was rebranded as Electra Ltd.

By 31 March 2022 the network had 2,350km of transmission lines, 45,948 customers and 10 substations with two more being planned, Waikawa Beach and one to back up Foxton and Shannon load growth. Eighteen electricity retailers used the lines to deliver electricity to customers.

While the name of the company and its logo may have changed, its commitment to community has never wavered. Next month we will focus on Electra's contribution to its community over the past 100 years.
