Our Community

Horowhenua SeniorNet began in 1999 following a public meeting to see if there was sufficient interest to form a group of seniors to help other seniors with digital technology. More than 100 people attended with many signing up on the spot.

Sessions cover basic word processing skills, file management and emailing. Further courses are offered such as intermediate word processing, PowerPoint presentations, digital camera use, spreadsheets and greeting cards in Word. If there is interest in a topic, SeniorNet try to create a class for it.

Savvy Seniors

The organisation has gone from strength to strength despite having to change venue a number of times. In the early years the group was a bit pushed for tutors, but as eager students learned the programmes, they in turn became tutors.

Every month an afternoon get together session is held at the Uniting Church, Oxford Street, Levin near the Adventure Park. The next one is on 7 May at 1pm. Everyone is welcome.

Weekly help sessions are held on Fridays at the Foxton Library from 10am until midday, and the Levin Library from 2pm until 4pm.

These library sessions are entirely free and open for anyone, regardless of age. Follow the signs in either library to find SeniorNet.
