the difference being all of the dances are a set routine of 16 bars that is repeated, everyone dances the same sequence of steps at the same time.

A very social, non-competitive group, the dances are held at Levin Senior Citizens Hall, Cambridge St, Levin every Thursday night from 7.15pm - 10pm. Free tuition is always available for newcomers. There is also a monthly

Saturday night dance, often with a theme, allowing everyone to get dressed up and have some fun.
